Notes from the Executive Committee Meeting

The Executive Committee (EC) met on Tuesday evening, November 28, and worked through a full agenda. I have lots to report, so let's get started!

- SHNA treasurer, Joanna Wiorkiewicz-Kuczera, reported that the Association has a balance of \$795.35 on November 28, 2017. She also reported that we have 138 members as of the same date, with no change from the September meeting.
- Our Lawrence Association of Neighborhoods representative, Kathy Heppert, reported that at the November LAN meeting the following items of interest to SHNA were discussed:
 - Short Term Rentals (i.e. Airbnb, VRBO): A work session was held on Nov. 14, 5:45pm, in the City Commission Room. <u>Visit the city</u> web site to view a presentation and report.
 - Neighborhoods near 23rd and Crestline are opposing rezoning for a large student housing complex. LAN is supporting their efforts to oppose the rezoning based its impact on the neighborhood and traffic issues.
 - Equitable funding for Sidewalk repair update: Community organizations are investigating possible funding sources (besides property or sales taxes) such as an opt-out sidewalk repair fund or a concrete fee similar to Storm Water Utility Fee.
 - o LAN is in need of a volunteer for Secretary and Vice-Chair.
- The City Commission has approved traffic calming devices for Rockledge between 6th and 9th streets. The project has been added to the prioritized list of traffic calming projects, and will be addressed again when it rises to the top of the list. This may take months or years.
- The EC voted to hold the Annual Meeting on April 16, 2018, at West Middle School multi-purpose room. Punch and cookies will be served. All members will receive a mailed invitation.
- The EC also voted to hold a neighborhood cleanup on April 28, 2018, and a neighborhood potluck on the evening of May 5, 2018, at the east pavilion in Centennial Park. SHNA will provide a main dish and drinks, neighbors are asked to bring side dishes and desserts. Look for more information in the next issue of the newsletter.
- The EC approved mailing a hard copy of the newsletter to members who do not use email. All members who provided email addresses will receive the newsletter via email.

The city has hired consultants to study a new location or locations for a transit hub for our bus system. One of the sites under consideration is on the southeast corner of Bob Billings Parkway and Crestline.
