LAN meeting notes 01/03/18

Rachel Lietz with *Represent Lawrence*. *Represent* supports the American Anti-corruption Act. The three main components of this act are:

- Stop political bribery, stop revolving door with 5 year ban
- End secret money
- Fix our broken elections

Represent submitted a non-binding resolution to City Commissioners in early September, stating that the city supports the act, and calls on the city and state to support the act. She has not had any significant response. Rachel would like LAN support, and would like to visit all neighborhood associations. LAN voted to submit a letter of support.

Travis Harrod asked LAN to send a letter to the Planning Commission in opposition to: amending the comprehensive plan, rezoning from RSO to RM15, and creating preliminary development plan. LAN agreed to send the letter *In the subsequent meeting, the Planning Commission denied the rezoning.*

Gary Webber reported that PedCo and Sustainability Action Network have hired Boog Highberger to investigate the feasibility and legality of a Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Fund paid by all property owners in the city.

LAN meeting notes 02/21/18

Melinda Henderson requested a letter from LAN in support neighborhood opposition to extension of 19th to O'Connell Rd. to submit to the T2040 comments. Motion passed.

Gary Webber reported that the Sidewalk Hazard Repair Program is tentatively scheduled to be discussed by City Commission at their March 6th meeting. Neighborhoods and interested citizens are encouraged to contact their commissioners prior to the March 6 meeting, and to attend the March 6 meeting and speak during the public comment period following commission discussion of this item.
