- SHNA treasurer, Joanna Wiorkiewicz-Kuczera, reported that the Association has a balance of \$780.45. She also reported that we have 140 members.

- Our 2018 Lawrence Association of Neighborhoods representative, Gary Webber, reported that at the January and February LAN meeting the following items of interest to SHNA were discussed:
  - 1. LAN accomplished the following in 2017:
    - Supported sidewalk repair efforts
    - Bus hub discussion (lot of discussion because of possible impact on University Place)
    - Oread Neighborhood Overlay District
    - Citywide parking study
      - Recommendations to H2020 update
      - Candidate questionnaire
    - Airbnb discussion
  - 2. Officers were elected for 2018:
    - Courtney Shipley: Chair
      - Jane Gibson: Vice Chair
    - Cindy Suenram: Treasurer
    - Secretary: Gary Webber
  - 3. LAN submitted a letter to the City Commission in support of *Represent Lawrence* which is promoting the American Anticorruption Act.
  - 4. LAN submitted a letter to the Planning Commission in opposition to: amending the comprehensive plan, and rezoning the lot at Clinton Parkway and Crestline from RSO to RM15. NOTE: In the subsequent meeting, the Planning Commission denied the plan change. The development planned for that lot has been abandoned for now.
  - 5. LAN submitted a letter to the City Commission supporting suggested changes to the Sidewalk Hazard Repair Program.
  - 6. The Transportation Plan revision currently underway proposes widening and extension of 19th St. east to O'Connell Rd. The T2040 plan revision is currently calling for comments, and adjacent neighborhoods (Barker, Brook Creek, University Place, Schwegler) are opposing these changes to 19th. LAN submitted a letter to the T2040 comments supporting their position.

• Clint Idol reported that the Rockledge traffic calming ballot was mailed to property owners with 300 feet of the location. 25 ballots

were mailed, 8 voted yes and 3 voted no. This did not meet the requirement of 70% or more of the property owners (18 of the 25) voting yes. Rockledge traffic calming was taken off of the city list for 2018.

- Matthew Paul reported that the SHNA website was receiving around 12 unique visits per day, with a total of 400 a month on the peak month.
- The EC discussed a policy for voting on controversial issues at the monthly LAN meeting. They decided that if the representative is confident that the action considered would be supported by SHNA if we were proposing it for our neighborhood, the representative would vote yes. Conversely, if the representative is confident our members would not support the action if it were proposed for our neighborhood, they would vote no. If the representative is unsure, they would abstain.
- Jeanne Pees proposed, and the motion passed, that we send a card and \$25 donation to the Robert W Lichtwardt Student Research Award. Bob Lichtwardt, a former member and longtime KU Biology Professor, passed away recently.

Committee members serve a three-year term, meet four times each year, and organize SHNA events and the Annual Meeting. # Sunset Hill Little Free Libraries

Little Free Libraries (LFL) have grown in popularity in the last few years. These tiny enclosures are miniature free lending libraries, normally built and maintained by homeowners or businesses. There are a number of attractive LFLs in our neighborhood, so we thought it might be interesting to our members to learn more about them.

Little Free Libraries encourage you to "Take a book-Return a book". You may return the book you borrow, or donate a new book to the library. As of November 2016, there were over 50,000 registered Little Free Library book exchanges in all 50 U.S. states and over 70 countries around the world.

Many LFLs are registered with a national organization, Little Free Library at <u>https://littlefreelibrary.org/</u>. When you register, there is a one-time payment of \$40 to get an official charter sign, engraved with a unique charter number. You also gain access to a network of benefits just for registered stewards and may legally call your book exchange box a Little Free Library.

Once you have registered, you may add your LFL to the <u>world map of</u> <u>libraries</u>. Searching for Lawrence on the map yields 13 registered LFLs, with one in Sunset Hill. However, there are actually 2 registered in our neighborhood, so 1 has not been added to the map. In addition, we know of 3 more book exchange boxes in Sunset Hill that do not appear to be registered with the worldwide organization. Here are some photos of Sunset Hill libraries.
