#### Street and Curb Work Delayed For a Second Year

In late 2019, SHNA learned that street work planned in 2019 for Schwarz Acres subdivision and curb work on the 2600 block of Orchard Lane would be deferred due to an excessively damaging winter.

Recently, the 2020 Street Maintenance Program was presented to the Multimodal Transportation Commission, and in the map, both projects were again missing. I contacted Steve Lashley, and received this reply

"The area around the 2600 block of Orchard internal street maintenance location has been currently deferred. We wanted to more accurately reflect those street maintenance locations on the 2020 program map that would realistically be completed in that maintenance year. The location has been retained on a deferred list for future maintenance."

The Lawrence Journal World publishes a monthly cuisine supplement called "Crave". This supplement is delivered to all JW subscribers in their daily paper.

# Housing Acronym Update: ADUs and STRs

The City Commission and staff are working on a number of changes to city zoning ordinances that affect our neighborhood.

The latest involves Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU). These are tiny houses that share a lot with a full-sized house, and may be occupied only by a relative of the owner. They are currently allowed in all residential zoning areas except the smallest, RS5. RS5 zones are single family residential lots between 5000 and 7000 square feet. Staff has proposed allowing ADUs in RS5 zones. This was attempted in 2013, and failed. There is significant neighborhood opposition to this proposal.

Regulations for operating whole-home short-term rentals (STR) are still in flux after much discussion. As part of its meeting Tuesday Feb. 18, the Lawrence City Commission voted unanimously to reject a set of new rules for whole-home short-term rentals. The commission then asked staff to craft a different proposal with stricter limitations. That proposal should arrive before the commission later this spring.
