- Neighborhood Issues & Concerns Common questions (Webber)
 - Westar power outages and interruptions report outage by phone or online, report interruptions to Customer Service by phone. Report every occurrence.
 - Traffic safety concerns (speeding vehicles, vehicles running stops signs, making illegal turns, failing to yield at crosswalks and other hazardous traffic operations)
 Report concerns using the city's <u>Traffic Safety Reporting Tool</u>.
 - Noise contact Lawrence Police Dept.
 - Drug or suspicious residences contact Lawrence Police Dept.
 - City Services concerns (code violations, potholes, downed trees, parks issues, traffic signal, abandoned vehicle, and more) – submit request for service online at <u>https://lawrenceks.org/listens/</u>
 - Pet waste City Ordinance 7125 requires owners of animals to remove waste and to be in possession of a means to remove waste when outside their property. Exception for physical disability of visual impairment. Minimum fine is \$10 plus court costs. Please be a good neighbor and pick up after your pets!
